Cultural studies of the Portuguese-speaking world are taught in English, in such departments as Interdisciplinary Studies, Modern Languages & Literatures, History, Economics, and Art History.

Portuguese is the 6TH most widely spoken language in the world, the third most spoken language in the Western Hemisphere after English and Spanish. It is the official language of Brazil (the largest Lusophone country, the 5th largest economy in the world) Portugal, Angola, Cape Verde, Guinea-Bissau, Mozambique, and São Tomé & Príncipe.

Knowledge of the Lusophone cultures is essential for understanding the political, economic, and social world with which the United States has increasing ties. Besides study abroad opportunities, knowledge of Portuguese and Lusophone cultures may help you find a career in government, communications, and international relations/business. Students who have already completed their language requirement can add Portuguese to their studies before finishing their degree.
